

MATERIALS:

[1] APNSH Panel

1-3/4 yards Blender Sky

1 yard Blender Chambray

1-1/8 yards Blender Denim

3/4 yard Blender Forest

7/8 yard Blender Moss

1-3/4 yards Plaid

1/2 yard Stamps

5/8 yard Circles

5-1/2 yards fabric of choice or

2-3/4 yard 108" wide for backing

King Batting or 2-3/4 yard of 108" batting

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING THIS PROJECT. FABRICS ARE SEWN RIGHT-SIDES TOGETHER USING A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER; HST = HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From APNSH Panel:

Fussy cut [6] — 13-1/2" squares

From Blender Sky Fabric:

Cut [2] — 4" × WOF strips

Subcut [18] — 4" squares **(A)**

Cut [4] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [36] — 3-1/2" squares **(D)**

Cut [12] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [12] — 2-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangles **(H)**

Subcut [18] — 2-1/2" × 3-1/2" rectangles **(C)**

Subcut [72] — 2-1/2" squares **(B)**

From Blender Chambray Fabric:

Cut [2] — 4" × WOF strips

Subcut [18] — 4" squares **(A)**

Cut [1] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [9] — 3-1/2" squares **(D)**

Cut [8] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [18] — 2-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(E)**

Subcut [36] — 2-1/2" × 3-1/2" rectangles **(C)**

From Blender Denim Fabric:

Cut [2] — 5-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [6] — 5-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(F)**

Cut [7] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips, sew together end to end

Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" × 65-1/2" strips

Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" × 71-1/2" strips

From Blender Moss Fabric:

Cut [8] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips, sew together end to end

Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" × 71-1/2" strips

Subcut [2] — 3-1/2" × 77-1/2" strips

From Plaid Fabric:

Cut [2] — 3-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [4] — 3-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangles **(I)**

Cut [8] — 6-1/2" × WOF strips, sew together end to end

Subcut [2] — 6-1/2" × 77-1/2" strips

Subcut [2] — 6-1/2" × 89-1/2" strips

From Stamps Fabric:

Cut [1] — 13-1/2" × WOF strip

Subcut [4] — 10-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangles **(J)**

From Circles Fabric:

Cut [2] — 8-1/2" × WOF strips

Subcut [6] — 8-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(G)**


From Blender Forest Fabric:

Cut [10] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips for binding


BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

Main Block Unit

1. Mark lines 1/4" on each side of the diagonal on the back of all [18] of the Blender Sky 4" squares **(A)**.
2. Place [1] Blender Sky **(A)** and [1] Blender Chambray **(A)** with RST.
3. Sew on the marked lines.
4. Cut between the sewn lines on the drawn lines. Press seams open. Trim the [36] HST to 3-1/2" square.



5. Mark a line on the diagonal of [36] of the Blender Sky 2-1/2" squares **(B)**.
6. Place [1] Blender Sky squares **(B)** on the left side of [1] Blender Chambray 2-1/2" × 3-1/2" rectangles **(C)**.
7. Sew on the diagonal line.
8. Cut 1/4" away from the sewn line. Press seam open. Repeat to make [18].
9. Make [18] more with the **(B)** square on the upper right side of the **(C)** rectangles.



10. Sew [1] Blender Sky/Blender Chambray HST from Step 4 on each side of [1] Blender Sky 3-1/2" squares **(D)**. Repeat to make [18].



11. Sew [1] Blender Sky 3-1/2" squares **(D)** on each side of [1] Blender Chambray 3-1/2" squares **(D)**. Repeat to make [9].



12. Sew [1] row from Step 10 in between [2] HST rows from Step 9. Repeat to make [9] units.



13. Sew [1] unit from Step 8 on each side of [1] Blender Sky 2-1/2" × 3-1/2" rectangles **(C)**. Repeat to make [18].



14. Sew [1] unit from Step 12 above and below unit from Step 11. Repeat to make [9].



15. Sew [2] Blender Sky 2-1/2" squares **(B)** on each end of [1] Chambray 2-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(E)**. See Figure 1A. Repeat to make [18].
16. Sew [1] unit from Step 14 on each side of unit from Step [13] to complete the block. See Figure 1B. Repeat to make [9] – 13-1/2" blocks.



Navy Block Unit

1. Sew [1] Blender Denim 5-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(F)** to [1] Circles 8-1/2" × 9-1/2" rectangles **(G)** on the 9-1/2" side.
2. Sew [1] Blender Sky 2-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangle **(H)** on the top and bottom.



Green Block Unit

1. Sew [1] Plaid 3-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangles **(I)** to [1] Stamps 10-1/2" × 13-1/2" rectangles **(J)** on the 13-1/2" side.



ROW ASSEMBLY:

1. **Row 1:** Sew together [1] Main Block, [1] fussy cut Fish Block, [1] Green Block, [1] fussy cut Seal Block, and [1] Main Block. Make sure to turn Green Block to match the layout on the next page.



- Row 2:** Sew together [1] Navy Block, [1] Main Block, [1] fussy cut Bear Block, [1] Main Block, and [1] Navy Block. Make sure to turn Navy Block to match layout.



- Row 3:** Sew together [1] Green Block, [1] Navy Block, [1] Main Block, [1] Navy Block, and [1] Green Block. Make sure to turn the Green and Navy Blocks to match layout.



- Row 4:** Sew together [1] Navy Block, [1] Main Block, [1] fussy cut Crab Block, [1] Main Block, and [1] Navy Block.



- Row 5:** Sew together [1] Main Block, [1] fussy cut Deer Block, [1] Green Block, [1] fussy cut Beaver Block, and [1] Main Block.




QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

- Sew Rows 1 - 5 together.

BORDERS:

- Sew Border 1 using Blender Denim 3-1/2" × 65-1/2" strips to the right and left sides of the quilt top.
- Then, sew the Blender Denim 3-1/2" × 71-1/2" strips on the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- Sew sides of Border 2 using Blender Moss 3-1/2" × 71-1/2" strips on the quilt top.
- Then, sew the Blender Moss 3-1/2" × 77-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of quilt top center.
- Sew side of Border 3 using Plaid 6-1/2" × 77-1/2" strips pieces. Then sew Plaid 6-1/2" × 89-1/2" strips to the top and bottom of quilt top center.



FINISHING:

- Layer the quilt top with batting and backing.
- Quilt as desired.
- Bind.
- Label & Enjoy!
